Patient: Mixed breed dog, 4 months, female **Surgeon**: Ciprian OBER, DVM, PhD, ResECVS

Anamnesis: found on the street Complementary exams: X Rays

Physical exam: grade 4 lameness on the right hindlimb, with marked thigh muscle atrophy; very limited range of motion at the level of right stifle; marked cvadriceps contracture; good general status.

X rays: outward rotation of the right distal femur; inward rotation of the proximal ttibia with medial patellar luxation; no evidence of trochlear groove.

Diagnosis: severe angular limb deformity with grade 4 patellar luxation and marked cvadriceps contracture.

Surgery: distal femoral osteotomy and trochlear sulcoplasty; medial retinacular release and lateral retinacular imbrication with fabello-parapatellar eight suture imbrication.

Postoperative care: antibiotics, analgesics, cage rest.

4 weeks control xrays
physical rehabilitation after suture removal (10-12 days)
